Pupil Premium Funding and Outcomes 2016 - 2017

Pupil Premium

We now receive pupil premium funding which is given to schools for each pupil registered and eligible for pupil premium. The funding is currently £1320 per pupil. This money enables us to support these pupils in any way necessary to improve their education.

You are entitled to claim for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Job Seekers Allowance (income based) or Income Support
- Child Tax Credit (not working Tax Credit) provided your annual income, assessed by the Inland Revenue does not exceed £16,190 (Please note, anyone receiving Working Tax Credit, regardless of income, will not qualify)
- Employment Support Allowance (income related)
- Guaranteed Element of Pension Tax Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support (NASS)

All "looked after" children are entitled to pupil premium. The "virtual School" provides a set amount which is spent as detailed below; however we are able to apply for further funding if a child needs more intensive support than this would allow for.

At Oldbrook First School the additional funding was used in the following ways to support pupils:

- To provide greater focus on accelerating progress in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- To provide short-term intervention programmes for underachieving pupils.
- To provide reading recovery approaches to accelerate progress in reading.
- Acquiring materials and accessing staff training aimed at raising standards.
- To provide language support for individual and groups of children.
- To provide social and emotional support for individuals and families.
