## School Uniform

Oldbrook First School has a bright and practical school uniform which we believe will help the children to adopt a community identity. The following are our agreed school colours and uniform expectations. ## School Uniform Continued...

---

Children are expected to be able to dress and undress themselves, so clothing that is easy to manage is recommended. Short-sleeved polo shirts are much easier for young children to manage than blouses/shirts with small buttons. Please ensure that all uniform is named including shoes.

Children need to wear sensible shoes to school. High-heeled shoes, strappy sandals, clogs and other unsuitable footwear should not be worn for safety reasons.

If you are planning on having your child's ears pierced please wait until the summer holidays so there is enough time for them to heal before they need removing for PE. Earrings can only be studs. No other jewellery should be worn.

## School Dinners

---

School meals at Oldbrook First School are now provided by St Paul's Catholic School. The meals this week have been of a high quality and the children have really enjoyed eating them. Thank you for your patience in ordering school meals. If you have not already done so please logon through Wisepay to order your child's meals for the rest of the term. All orders need to be received by midnight on Wednesday for the following week. We offer a full hot meal service with meat, vegetarian and jacket potato options. St Paul's operate a 3-week menu which was sent out via ParentMail and is also on our school website. All families should have received an email with details of how to order using the online ordering service - Wisepay. The Wisepay system is managed by St Paul's School and any queries should be addressed to them. 
Please note that at this time we are unable to accept packed lunches from home; all children will need to order a hot school meal through Wisepay.
