For the academic year 2019/20 we will receive £42,240 in Pupil Premium funding (32 pupils @ £1,320 per pupil, 5 Pupils @ £320).

Barriers to Learning

The main barriers to educational achievement which may be faced by eligible pupils are listed below. Our pupil premium grant will be spent to address, minimise and diminish barriers to learning and to improve outcomes. As the needs of all our children are so vast, termly pupil progress meetings identify individual needs and discussions take place around the support that is needed.

At Oldbrook First School we currently use the additional funding in the following ways to support the above:

- To provide greater focus on accelerating progress in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- To provide greater challenge for more able pupils eligible for Pupil Premium.
- To provide short-term intervention programmes for underachieving pupils.
- To provide reading recovery approaches to accelerate progress in reading.
- Acquiring materials and accessing staff training aimed at raising standards.
- To provide language support for individual and groups of children.
- To provide social and emotional support for individuals and families.

Outcome

Due to the impact of COVID-19 and school closure data is only measured up until the end of Term 4, recording pupils working at the expected level by the end of Term 4. Strong progress is categorised as 9 or more points.

All pupils made good progress up until the disruption of schooling due to COVID-19. At the end of Term 4 pupils entitled to pupil premium were attaining above all pupils at the expected level. This shows the impact of teaching and the planned strategy up until Easter 2020. Progress overtime was strong for all pupils and slightly less for pupil premium pupils.
