

English:

This half term we will be reading a range of stories written by the famous author Beatrix Potter and discussing the style and features of her stories. We will be making inferences about the characters and describing the characters and setting using adjectives and adventurous language. We will be planning and writing our own stories based on what we have learnt from Beatrix Potter. The children will also use their learning about mini beasts to write their own information text.

We will also continue to focus on developing the children's spelling, punctuation and grammar learning through literacy and phonics sessions.

Questions:

What are the similarities and differences between Beatrix Potters' Stories. Are any of the characters similar?

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Maths:

We will be continuing to read and write, as words, numbers to 100 and learning about place value and partitioning numbers. We will be exploring fractions and solving problems with them. The class will continue to investigate number problems using all four operations and will be explaining how they came across the answer. The children will also be continuing to learn to tell the time in 5 minute intervals, and will be developing their understanding of positional language and directions.

Questions:

How many ways can you partition 45? How many tens and how many ones are in 56? How else could you partition 56? How many seconds are there in a minute? How many minutes in an hour? How many hours in a day?

Reading

Children will be reading a range of texts, fiction, non-fiction and poetry. We will discuss the features of each genre of books as well as developing inference skills. We will focus on non-fiction books primarily, discussing the features of a non-fiction text (contents, index, glossary, photographs, questions, sub headings)

Questions:

How do you think Peter Rabbit feels when he is chased from Mr McGregor's garden? Can you tell me x means? Can you find a verb in the text? Can you find an adjective in the text?

This half term our topic will be based on *Beatrix Potter* and much of our work will be cross-curricular, linking subjects wherever possible.

Science:

This half terms focus is on plants and animals in our local environment and their habitat and life cycle. We will be learning that plants and animals reproduce, what happens to a seed when it grows and where seeds are found.

Questions:

What is a habitat? What types of habitats can you name? What habitat is suitable for an amphibian? What is a suitable habitat for a reptile? What habitat is suitable for a minibeast? What is the life cycle of a frog? What is the life cycle of a human?

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Art:

In art we will be looking at the illustrations of Beatrix Potter. We will be learning to observe living things very carefully and draw exactly what we see. We will be exploring drawing and painting techniques, using view finders and magnifying glasses.

History:

In history we will be comparing Beatrix Potter and Steve Backshall and researching why they are famous. Children will learn why they are important people and share ideas about their lives. We will discuss the history of Beatrix Potter, her life and how she created the famous characters we read about today.

Computing:

We will continue our learning about algorithms. We will also be learning to name, recognise and use a variety of technology. The children will be exploring the uses of technology both in school and in the wider world.

PSHE:

This half term the topic is 'Going for Goals', within this topic children will be learning what it means to have a goal and to plan small steps in order to achieve it. Our BLP learning will help us to persevere when we find things tricky! Our core school value that we are focusing on this term is **Responsibility** we will be thinking about how we can be responsible.

PE:

This half term we will be doing gymnastics, learning the skills needed to create movements both on mats and on apparatus. They will also be doing a unit on dance linked to the plants.

Music:

This term's music is focused around a Reggae song called Zootime. We will know how songs have a chorus and response and how they can tell a story. We will learn to play a tuned instrument in parts and play in time with a steady pulse.

Children's PE lessons this half term will be on a Wednesday and a Thursday. If your child has their ears pierced please ensure they are taken out in advance or they are able to remove them themselves.

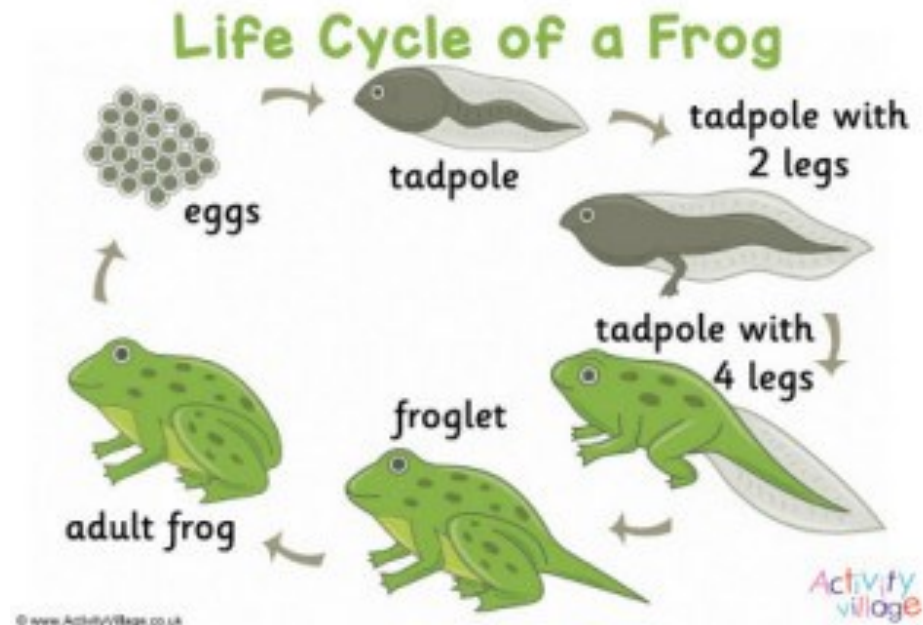
