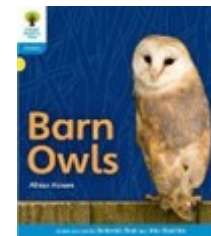
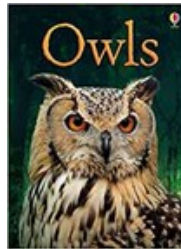
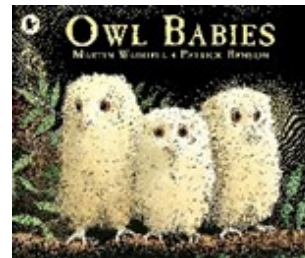
PSED:

We will continue to follow the class routines and rules and will not need reminding to do so. We will start to learn and play in larger groups, listening to our friends and incorporating their ideas in our learning. We will select and use resources to help us learn. Our value for the term is **Responsibility**.

Physical Development:

We will continue to develop our fine motor skills through play dough modelling, painting, cutting and drawing activities. In our weekly Dough Gym sessions we will follow a routine to music, strengthening our fingers and hands in readiness for writing and drawing. Wednesday PE sessions will help us improve our moving and balancing skills, as well as keeping in time to the music. We will learn how to do up our own coats and shoes to access the outside area.

Why do owls fly at night?



Maths:

We will develop our understanding of numbers and quantity through activities involving chanting, counting and matching. We will learn that the last number reached when counting is the **total**. We will continue pattern and colour reinforcement through art activities.

Literacy:

We will begin to understand that:
print has meaning
print can have different purposes
we read English text from left to right and from top to bottom
the names of the different parts of a book
page sequencing

Understanding of the World:

We will find out about the celebration of Diwali, Christmas & the tradition of bonfire night and talk about our experience of these festivals. We will learn vocabulary related to owls and find out about how they live. The term 'nocturnal' will be introduced and we will find out which animals are awake at night.

Expressive Arts and Design:

We will be developing our imaginative role play in the home corner while acting out family customs and traditions associated with festivals. We will experiment with paint, using it freely to create our own work and also painting owls and nocturnal animals. We will create Christmas decorations.
