English:

This half term we will be reading a range of stories written by the well known author Beatrix Potter and discussing the style and features of her stories. We will be making inferences about the characters and describing the characters and setting using adjectives and adventurous language. We will be planning and writing our own stories based on what we have learnt from Beatrix Potter. The children will also use their learning about animals to write a non fiction text. We will also continue to focus on developing the children's spelling, punctuation and grammar learning through literacy and phonics sessions.

Questions:

What are the similarities and differences between Beatrix Potter's stories. What language does she use that we don't commonly use nowadays? How does she make a naughty character so loveable?

Reading

Children will be reading a range of texts, fiction, non-fiction and poetry. We will discuss the features of each genre of books as well as developing inference skills. We will focus on non-fiction books primarily, discussing the features of a non-fiction text (contents, index, glossary, photographs, questions, sub headings)

Questions:

How do you think Peter Rabbit feels when he is chased from Mr McGregor's garden? Can you tell me what xxx means? Can you find a verb in the text? Can you find an adjective in the text?

Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter Term 4



This half term our topic will be based on Beatrix Potter and much of our work will be cross-curricular, linking subjects wherever possible.



Maths:

We will be continuing to read and write, as words, numbers to 100 and learning about place value and partitioning numbers. We will be exploring fractions and solving problems with them. The class will continue to investigate number problems using all four operations and will be explaining how they came across the answer. The children will also be continuing to learn to tell the time in 5 minute intervals, and will be developing their understanding of positional language and directions.

Questions:

How many ways can you partition 45? How many tens and how many ones are in 56? How else could you partition 56? How many seconds are there in a minute? How many minutes in an hour? How many hours in a day? What will the time be in one hour? What will the time be in one hour and 45 minutes?

Science:

This half terms focus is on plants and animals in our local environment and their habitat and life cycle. We will be learning that plants and animals reproduce, what happens to a seed when it grows and where seeds are found.

Questions:

What is a habitat? What types of habitats can you name? What habitat is suitable for an amphibian? What is a suitable habitat for a reptile? What habitat is suitable for a minibeast? What is the life cycle of a frog? What is the life cycle of a human?

Art:

In art we will be looking at the illustrations of Beatrix Potter. We will be looking closely at her technique and drawing our favourite characters using a range of mediums; pencil, watercolour, chalks and charcoals. Children will explore using each medium and produce a final art work piece using their preferred medium.

History:

In history we will be comparing Beatrix Potter and Steve Backshall and researching why they are famous. Children will learn why they are important people and share ideas about their lives. We will discuss the history of Beatrix Potter, her life and how she created the famous characters we read about today.

Computing:

This half term we will be looking at data collection making links to our learning in maths last half term. Children will be looking at different ways of presenting this data; block diagrams, pictograms and graphs. Children will then use that information to answer questions.

Year 2 Term 4



PSHE:

This half term our theme is 'Healthy Me'. Over the half term we will learn about how to keep our bodies healthy, how to relax when feeling stressed, how medicines work in our bodies and how to safely use them, which food groups foods belong to and which food groups our bodies need every day and understand which food groups give my body energy.

PE:

This half term we will be doing dance and invasion games. In dance we will be creating a Beatrix Potter inspired animal dance. Invasion games will teach us gross motor skills and the strategies needed for invasion sports.

Music:

This terms music is an exploration of beat and rhythm using crotchets and quavers. It begins with on-the-spot actions, followed by stepping the durations, stick notation will be introduced and children will go on to create their own 4-beat patterns.






